



Call for Student Applications for LU-PRISM 2023

Duration: 8 weeks (May 13 – July 3, 2024)

Student stipend: \$3,500 (+ room and board)

You are cordially invited to apply to LU-PRISM (Longwood University Perspectives on Research In Science & Mathematics), our residential summer research program. This program combines practical training in specific research techniques with activities designed to put the research into the context of larger goals of modern science, technology, health, and mathematics.

Undergraduate scholarly research is one of the most important things you can do to distinguish yourself from other students applying to graduate schools, professional schools, and post-baccalaureate employment. Don't let this opportunity pass you by! Apply today!

The program looks to fund 12 traditional seats in the program, five seats reserved for science and math educational students, and many others through other granted opportunities. In addition, PRISM will be pairing up with outside organizations to bring internships or external research opportunities to our students. When applying make sure to indicate whether or not you are interested in any of these other PAID summer opportunities. Due to the early nature of the application process this year, you need to provide your discipline of interest rather than choosing a faculty mentor. The faculty mentors will still choose student researchers much like the process in the past, but we will be using your qualifications and discipline(s) of interest to pair you up with other possible summer opportunities! With an abundance of paid opportunities this summer it has never been a better time to apply.

Student eligibility requirements:

1. Students in any major are eligible.
2. Student must be a continuing Longwood undergraduate in Fall 2024.
3. Students who have previously participated in PRISM are not eligible for the traditional 12 seats.

Application instructions:

1. Prepare a response to the following: Provide a brief summary of your career goals and describe how your education and training has prepared you for these goals. Describe how participation in this program will help you attain your career goals. Limit to one page, single spaced. Save your response as a pdf file.
2. Save a copy of your unofficial transcripts as a pdf file. You can access your unofficial transcripts through myLongwood.

4. Complete all requested information, including uploading pdf files.
