I'd like to update you on a few items as we move through the early days of October.

<u>Covid-19</u>

Cases are continuing on college campuses across Virginia, and unfortunately again ticking up again nationally over the last two weeks. Here at Longwood, in the past few days we are also seeing an uptick in student positive cases. While fluctuations in our active cases are expected, this can be an extremely contagious virus and we must recommit ourselves to the steps that will limit spread.

That means social distancing, hand hygiene, and face coverings. And it means staying the course not just visibly on campus, during the day and in classroom settings with our precautions in place and working well, but in all interactions off campus as well. Remember that by returning to campus this fall, students pledged to abide by the <u>Shared Commitment</u> developed by the SGA and other student leaders.

That commitment includes not attending gatherings -- on campus or off, here or elsewhere -- where safety guidelines are not met. Please honor that commitment, and the associated Student Conduct and Integrity rules in the student handbook, which will be aggressively enforced. Do not be the person who lets your guard down, catches this virus and spreads it to others.

It's also extremely important to reach out to the University Health Center if you have <u>possible</u> <u>symptoms</u>. Possible symptoms of Covid-19 can overlap with other common ailments. UHC now has some improved testing tools and resources allowing many of those with symptoms to get quicker results. What that means is if you come in with symptoms, you may now be able to receive a quicker initial result and if negative avoid having to quarantine while awaiting results. Flu shots are especially important this year. For students, there will be two walk-in flu shot clinics at the UHC this month. There is no appointment necessary, just come with a face covering to get your flu shot. They are:

In an actual earthquake residents in affected areas should drop to the ground, take cover, and hold on. The drill will last approximately five minutes.
