**Policy\***

For First Year Students:

8. A formal Application for Degree. File an application for degree in the Office of the Registrar prior to the anticipated completion of 75 credit hours. Transfer credit is included in the calculation of credit hours completed. A registration hold will be placed on a student's record prior to open registration during the term a student is anticipated to complete more than 75 credit hours if an Application for Degree has not been submitted.

For Transfer Students:

10. A formal Application for Degree. File an application for degree in the Office of the Registrar prior to the anticipated completion of 75 credit hours. Transfer credit is included in the calculation of credit hours completed. A registration hold will be placed on a student's record prior to open registration during the term a student is anticipated to complete more than 75 credit hours if an Application for Degree has not been submitted.

**BACKGROUND**

Longwood puts a hold on registration before the student can register during the semester it is anticipated that they will complete at least 75 credits, including transfer credits. Longwood has done this for years. The language in the catalog needs to be clarified and made more explicit.

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**RATIONALE**

Provide a brief statement as to why the new policy, the proposed changes, or the deletion is needed*	The application for degree needs to be completed in time for the Office of the Registrar to notify students in time for the students to prepare and still have a full Fall and Spring semester left to correct any deficiencies. Previous to the current policy holds were placed on student accounts on the Monday after the exams were completed to put the students at 75 credits or more. This caused significant problems as they tried to complete their degree application over summer or winter break.
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
