**Policy\*** COURSE PREFIXES

Each academic prefix, such as MATH, EDUC, ACCT, etc. will be the responsibility of a specific department or academic unit. No course may be created and no section of a course may be offered without the approval of the administrative leader of that unit. Furthermore, no change in a course may be made without the approval of the administrative leader of that academic unit. If a new prefix is created, the units in charge of similar prefixes or who might be affected by the change must be consulted.

An academic prefix for an existing major or minor is the responsibility of the department that administers that major or minor. Prefixes for courses which do not lead to a major or minor will be the responsibility of the unit that originated or historically controlled it. Prefixes for professional studies courses taken by non-degree seeking students (e.g., PEDU, PCSD) that match existing courses in other disciplines (e.g., EDUC, CSDS, respectively) are the responsibility of the department or unit that administers the original prefix. Prefixes not in any of the previous categories, such as GNEP or CTZN, will be assigned to a unit by the PVPAA. The registrar's office will keep a record of the unit to which each prefix is assigned.

The creation of an interdisciplinary prefix or any course in a specifically interdisciplinary prefix (e.g., HBSI) requires the documentation and justification of the faculty credentials required to teach such a course. Completed documentation resides in Academic Affairs.

## **BACKGROUND**
