

Statement of General Transfer Policy

In general, credits are accepted from institutions that are accredited by the appropriate regional accreditation agency provided such credits carry a grade of "C" or better (or a "Pass" option if it is equivalent to a "C" or better) and are comparable to courses offered at Longwood University (see exceptions listed in Specific Policies). Transfer of credit does not necessarily imply applicability to specific degree requirements.

BACKGROUND

Currently there is no allowance for pass/fail courses where "pass" stands for "C" or better to transfer. The change to allow for this possibility, consistent with current transfer policy, was developed with input from Academic Affairs and the Registrar.

Longwood's current policy allows grades of "C" or better to transfer. Longwood does not transfer in these grades though, so allowing the transfer of a grade of "Pass" if the Pass is equivalent to a "C" or better is consistent with current policy.
