3. International Admissions Requirement

Proposal to add the International English Language Testing system (IELTS) for international students. Currently we accept TOEFL with established minimum scores. This addition would allow either TOEFL or IELTS in response to a growing number of applicants who have taken IELTS and not TOEFL.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

The University welcomes applications from prospective international students. In addition to possessing the equivalent of an undergraduate degree and a 2.75 cumulative GPA (on a 4.0 scale), the international student must also demonstrate proficiency in the English language through the TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) or International English Language Testing system (IELTS). A minimum score of 570 (paper test) or 220 (computer test) or 80 (Internet test) is required on the TOEFL or a minimum 6.5 on the IELTS for admission
