HIST 130. *World History: 1500 to Present.* World History: 1500 to the Present is a survey of world history from the end of the Medieval Era to the present. The course is a thematic and chronological treatment of events and developments in the history of states and major world regions, with an emphasis on state development, colonialism, industrialization and modernity, global conflicts and contemporary ideologies. 3 credits. Required for Concentration: Teacher Preparation in History and Social Science BA Degree.

III. Rationale for Course:

Deleting HIST 210: World History and replacing it with HIST 120 World History to 1500 and HIST 130 World History: 1500 to the Present is beneficial because:

- A two semester survey, split at the year 1500, will allow greater depth of coverage and is in line with best practices in the field.
- The greater depth of coverage will better prepare Teacher Preparation majors, who are required by the History and Social Science Standards of Learning for Virginia Public Schools to have content mastery of World History and Geography to 1500, and World History and Geography 1500 to Present.
- Over the past decade the History Department has increased the number of faculty with expertise in World History. Starting in Fall 2014 there will be three faculty members who specialize in World History. The splitting of World History into two semesters will better enable the deployment of the expertise and skills of these faculty members.
