## Summary of Action by the Honors Advisory Committee, 2008-2009

Members of the committee this year were:

The committee met periodically throughout the year.

The major actions of the committee were as follows:

- Hosted information sessions for the campus community to introduce the new Honors College.
- Proposed to the Faculty Senate a revised committee structure to expand faculty and student participation.
- Planned a major all-day Open House in February, at which students were given an overview of the Honors College, an opportunity to tour Wheeler Hall, and "mock" Honors class experience. All 41 prospective students in attendance also interviewed for a major merit-based scholarship award.
- Identified, in collaboration with colleagues across campus, candidates for three major scholarships: the Hull Education Scholars (7 awards, \$5000 per year for four years), the Cormier Citizen Scholars (4 awards, \$5500 per year for four years), and the Longwood Scholars (3 awards, \$3000+ per year for four years).
- Reviewed files for the Advanced Honors Scholarship, selecting rising junior John-Harwood Scott for a major award and rising juniors Jennifer Curfman, Ashley Steadman, Benjamin Bilodeau, and Emmilee Mizerak for smaller awards.
