- <u>Courier</u>: Courier service between libraries will be running on Wednesdays. You can pick up holds from the cart at the Library entrance. This program is only for print materials.

- <u>Links</u>: Double-check any links you provide to students, to ensure they are pointing to the new catalog. In addition to the new SALSA program, the Library, in partnership with the Office of Student Conduct and Integrity, now offers an Ethical Research canvas page.
