III. Rationale for Proposed Changes:

In order to ensure that students entering Math 164 have the appropriate level of algebra skills to succeed in the course, we will require students to pass an algebra readiness test. Students have the opportunity to self-remediate until a passing score is achieved. The increased credit in Math 164 will allow us to devote more time to the study of each of the areas in the course description. Additionally we will introduce more applications to each of the areas, reinforcing students' skills in these topics and in algebra. We are also removing this course from satisyfing Goal 5 because that goal is designed for a 3 credit course. Changing Math 164 to a 4-credit course goes against this requirement, and allowing a 4-credit course in a 3 credit goal would set a precedent that a course with an arbitrary number of credit hours could satisfy any goal. Because the course content will not fundamentally change, and because we will have the chance to offer further applications, we believe that a student passing the course will have shown an understanding of mathematical thought and the ability to conceptualize and apply mathematical logic to problem solving.
