We propose that for GPA calculations, starting with all GPA calculations for all undergraduate students in Fall 2011, that + and - grades be computed in the GPA as follows. This would only affect grades assigned for classes from Fall 2011 forward.

Rationale for the proposal:

- 1) According to data compiled from the undergraduate catalogs of our 24 SCHEV-designated sister institutions, 20 of these institutions allow instructors to assign + and grades to students and have them count in their GPA.
- 2) Of both our SCHEV sister institutions and other VA state schools, only one other institution (University of Texas-Permian Basin) allows instructors to assign + or grades to students but does not allow them to count in GPA calculations.
- 3) While there is a vast difference between, for example, cumulative work earning a low B and that earning a high B, there is currently no distinction between those grades in terms of GPA. Similarly, while there is very little difference between high C and low B, there is a relatively enormous difference between these grades with regard to GPA. This new system would more accurately reflect the proximity of these grades.

Below is a list of all SCHEV sister schools. <u>None</u> of the schools that allow + and – in GPA calculations have the grade of A+ in their undergraduate catalog. Schools listed below in italics do NOT allow + and – grades to count in GPA calculations:
