Longwood University, a historic public liberal arts institution and host of the 2016 U.S. Vice Presidential Debate, invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track Assistant Professor of Education positions beginning August 2019. Qualified applicants must hold a Ph.D. or Ed.D. in Education. Applicants having completed coursework for the terminal degree may be considered depending on expected completion date.

The Department of Education and Counseling in the College of Education and Human Services seeks a candidate with a strong commitment to excellence and innovation in undergraduate teaching. In addition, it is highly preferred that the successful candidate must have a strong record of K-6 teaching, evidence of scholarship in the form of research and/or presentations at the local, regional, state, or national level, and an interest and willingness to be actively involved in the delivery of instruction and supervision through off-campus partnerships with local school divisions. The candidate must possess a current teaching license and an active research agenda.

This tenure-track position will focus on best practices and pedagogy in the areas of literacy with primary emphasis on curriculum/methods-based teaching assignments in the elementary/middle school programs. Additionally, the candidate could be considered a generalist in nature and have specific area(s) of expertise. Having three or more years of experience teaching in the elementary and/or middle school setting is required.

A comprehensive university with a strong liberal arts foundation, Longwood has a distinctive mission to develop citizen leaders who are prepared to make positive contributions to the common good of society. Founded in 1839, Longwood is the third-oldest public university in Virginia.

Longwood is part of the proud tradition of higher education in the Commonwealth of Virginia. Roughly one hour's drive from Charlottesville, Lynchburg, and Richmond, Longwood is located in the historic two-college community of Farmville. Longwood currently has more than 5,000 undergraduate and graduate students and more than 34,000 alumni. It maintains affiliations with the neighboring Robert Russa Moton Museum of civil rights history and the Longwood Center for Visual Arts, a nationally accredited university art museum. A member of the Big South Conference, Longwood competes at the NCAA Division I level.

Salary will be commensurate with credentials and experience. Commonwealth of Virginia benefits accompany this position. A successful criminal background investigation is required.
