Conference Call with Scantron

It also easily integrates with Canvas and Banner, which the University currently utilizes, to gather student data and report grades. The new software will run on the scanner that is currently in use. The system runs on Windows only at this time. Scantron and Remark Classic can accommodate any one of the pending recommendations that ATAC will make for the Scantron move from the Help Desk.
