The following is an explanation of the terminology used for the Disposition section of the Crime Log.

1. **Cleared by Arrest:** The subject(s) has been arrested or warrants/summons/petitions were served by the jurisdiction where the subject was located.
2. **Cleared by Exceptional Means:** In certain situations, elements beyond law enforcement's control prevent the agency from arresting and formally charging the offender. When this occurs, the agency can clear the offense *exceptionally*. Law enforcement agencies must meet the following four conditions in order to clear an offense by exceptional means. The agency must have:
  - a. Identified the offender.
  - b. Gathered enough evidence to support an arrest, make a charge, and turn over the offender to the court for prosecution.
  - c. Identified the offender's exact location so that the suspect could be taken into custody immediately.
  - d. Encountered a circumstance outside the control of law enforcement that prohibits the agency from arresting, charging, and prosecuting the offender.Some examples are:
  - 1) The death of the offender
  - 2) The prosecution declined (for other than lack of probable cause)
  - 3) The victim refused to cooperate (in the prosecution)
  - 4) The offender is in custody of another jurisdiction (includes extradition denied)
3. **Cleared Referred:** The case is being investigated by another law enforcement agency.
4. **Conduct Referral:** Case was sent to the Integrity and Conduct Board or the Title IX office
5. **Pending:** The case is currently being investigated.
6. **Closed Inactive:** No further investigative action is required or leads have been exhausted. Warning issued, subject barred or trespassed.
7. **Unfounded:** The case is determined through investigation to be false or baseless. No offense occurred nor was attempted.
8. **Title IX Report Only:** The incident was reported to the University Title IX office which made the police department aware. Subject did not wish to file a report with Law Enforcement.

Daily crime logs older than 60 days may be obtained from the Longwood University Police Department Administrative Lieutenant or Chief of Police.
