- Students also are saying that they are learning a sense of responsibility while working in conjunction with the other building supervisors.
- In the end of the year evaluation students stated they learned the following: *The student workers learned a sense of responsibility through the tasks that are given to them to complete during their shift.

*Since they are responsible for their shift, they have gained a sense of accountability and responsibility because they are the one person who needs to have the shift covered and if it is not they are held accountable. They are also aware of the effects if they do not show up for their assigned shift. *Students have a better understanding of the need to show up to work on time and be professional.
