

Diversified Revenue Generation is Key to Sustainability







Average Generated Credits Across Graduate Programs 2020 – 2022 (averaged over two years)







MBA Enrollment has Grown Significantly in Two Years










MBA last two years 1,054 students




MBA Students are Very Diverse






CEHHS Graduate Students Live Across the Region






CEHHS Graduate Students Represent Diverse Life Experience






Communication Sciences & Disorders Cohort Age Range

Educational Leadership Endorsement Coursework: A Different Model

Our Model

Hybrid: 5 class meetings per semester (3 in person; 2 virtual) & Online

Teaching Triad: 3 instructors teach 7 credits each semester for 3 semesters/work as a team

Offers only the courses needed for an educator already holding a masters to add the VDOE endorsement

Working with professionals in the field to both generate and deliver curriculum increases diversity, provides current industry perspectives and experience, and brings people extremely dedicated and hard working to serve our students.

2022	12 cohorts	156 students

Our Instructors

We have 29 instructors.

26 are adjuncts with current experience as superintendents, principals, central office leadership

12 are women; 17 are men

27% are from historically underrepresented groups


All of them meet with us three times a year to discuss and improve curriculum and instruction

Our Students


Nearly 50% of our students have gone on to become administrators (CAEP Study).
850 students completed the 21 credit hours of endorsement coursework since 2016
Over 500 students successfully earned their Administration & Supervision PreK-12 endorsement
Our students have a pass rate on the SLLA (required for endorsement) of over 99%


