Discussion Item - FPPM Section VI.O. 9c Faculty Status and Grievances - Date Update

Per the FPPM, the first round of voting ballots shall be distributed to faculty "during the month of February" (p.302, d.2.). The proposed change is to incorporate the date of February 1 into the FPPM. There being no discussion, the change will be voted on at the next Senate meeting.

Discussion Item – Reviewing Final Exam Policy (FPPM Section II.E)

This discussion item was a roll over from the last Senate meeting where senators were asked to review the exam policy with their department to determine if a change was needed to the policy. After the discussion, it was determined that there is support for the policy but clarification is needed to avoid scheduling conflicts among the faculty.

Report – National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) report

Dr Tom Wears reviewed the findings of <u>The National Survey of Student Engagement Report (NSSE)</u>. The survey compares Longwood University with southeast public institutions and is designed to measure the extent to which first-year and senior students engage in effective educational practices. Overall the report findings were very positive.
