The Special Education Endorsement Program is primarily designed for educators who have or are eligible for Virginia Elementary/Secondary Initial or Continuing teaching license. The program will provide coherent preparation in all areas of the Special Education curriculum including field experience. Successful completion of the entire program will result in Longwood University, Office of Professional Services recommendation for the K-12 Special Education Endorsement. Incorporating the standards of the Council for Exceptional Children and the Department of Education Virginia (DOE), this endorsement program will expand the candidate's teaching skills and will help the candidate to make a significant and positive impact on struggling students in the General Curriculum K-12. Specifically, the program will consist of courses:

• To examine the characteristics of children and adolescents with exceptional learning needs in the general education curriculum .

• To learn how to plan for the individual needs of students with exceptional learning needs in the general education curriculum to support their strengths.

• To determine how to build collaborative relationships with parents and agencies to promote learning in all content areas.

• To participate in supervised fieldwork to prepare for the specific challenges of special education teaching.

Rationale for the program: <u>A special education endorsement will prepare educators to work directly with</u> students who have a range of disabilities, including learning disabilities, emotional behavioral disabilities, and Intellectual disabilities. A special education endorsement qualifies a teacher to work with students from kindergarten through high school, in resource or specialized program settings. Nationwide, over 6,000,000 children are now being served in special education in public schools. Approximately 10 to 15% of the students within any school district will have special needs. Moreover, the shortage of teachers qualified to address the needs of diversified students in the Virginia school system is growing ((www.doe.virginia.gov/teaching/workforce_data/shortage). Therefore, an endorsement program in Special Education General Curriculum will meet the high demand for teachers with endorsement in special education and they will be competitively prepared to address the unique needs of a wide range of students.
