



Application Guidelines for Faculty Participation in LU-PRISM 2026

Duration: 7 weeks (May 18 – July 3)

Participants: *Tenured or tenure-track faculty members* participating in STEM-H (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, Health) related research

Faculty stipend: \$7,175

Faculty applications will be evaluated based on quality of research, academic area (with a goal of having a diverse set of STEM-H disciplines represented in the program), tenure status, and, most importantly, alignment of student researcher role in the project with LU-PRISM student learning outcomes. Faculty who have not participated in LU-PRISM in previous summers are strongly encouraged to apply.

Each faculty member will mentor one or two students. Faculty mentors wishing to work with two students should provide justification in the proposal in section III: “Student Researcher Role in the Project”.

Faculty applications must include the following sections:

I. Cover Page

Name of Applicant

Academic Department and name of Department Chair*

Discipline (and sub-discipline where applicable)

Email Address

Date of Submission

II. Project Title & Abstract (250 word maximum)

III. Student Researcher Role in the Project (500 word maximum)

IV. Project Timeline for the 8-week program

Proposals must be submitted **electronically as a single PDF file** to Andrew Yeagley (yeagleyaa@longwood.edu) no later than 5:00pm on Friday, October 17.

***Department chair approval is required for all applications.** The department chair must be CC’ed on the application OR the application must contain the department chair’s signature.

If you are also interested in being a mentor for the Longwood Summer Scholars program, please indicate this in your submission email. Faculty who wish to participate in Longwood Summer Scholars will have their applications forwarded to the Director of the Longwood Summer Scholars program.
